why they call him Opal (?). He didn't go by Big Elk. I don't know why they did that. And I have a picture here of Mr.--Mr. Maker--Deer Horn Maker, in civilian clothes. I think this picture was taken in Hot Springs, Arkansas. Him with Mr. Antoine Pryor (46). And he's dressed in civilian clothes. They both had their picture taken with lion. (laughter). This (not clear) picture.

(This one here--this here's Antoine huh?)

That's Antoine.

(This here's my grandpa?)

Your grandpa. And I have a picture here—a picture of myself and anther Osage lady from here, name Josephine, used to be Warshe (47). She Miss Kipp—Mrs. Kipp and her daughter—her little daughter. Was taken in Washington, D.C. And this is a picture of Mrs. Blackdog (48). Her name was Lou Blackdog. She's very nice looking lady in this picture. She has full dressed in Osage clothes, with buckskin leggins, pretty shawl and pretty Indian shirt. She has earrings on and that's her—I don't know who this little child is, whether it's her's or her granddaughter I couldn't say. She's from Hominy.

(Oh, this picture. Who was she married to?)
Blackdog.

(Oh.)

And this picture.—This is one of the old pictures. And mere's another old picture, which I don't know their names, but I've heard of them and I think I've seen them, but not.—I guess when I was very young. It's Mrs. Pryor,7 and this other lady she must have been Albert Penn's wife, (49) that's Katherine's grandma. Some wore Washington pictures. This is very old picture again that's the family here of Ross Maker and wife and their four children (50). That's must have been you and Harry and Leona and
