Louis Red Eagle and his sister Mary and his little brother, I think this was name Joe. That was taken sometime way back there when they were all young.

(This was young man--what's his name?)

That's Harry.

(Oh.)

It's Paul Red Eagle's children. Mr. and Mrs. Paul Red Eagle's children. Harry and Louis and Mary (51). I have a very very old picture here. This was taken first delegation Osage Indians in 1875 (52). To Lawrence, Kansas. Think it's 1875, I think that's--

(1873.)

Um-huh. Their names is also on this card. You can't even see the names. Can you read the names?

(I think I've seen one of those pictures kind of--)

Enlarged?

(Enlarged.)

My mother said the reason why she had that picture--my mother said her uncle was one of them. You know all--most of them chiefs. Picture taken of that. Her uncle was chief. But she make--I don't remember the name. This is your dad and Howard Grissom.(no picture).

(Which one's Howard?)

This one. And this one's your dad. And I have a picture here Osage man fully dressed in Osage clothes. He seems to be--got a Osage blanket on, broadcloth, his beads cross and has beaded vest and kerchief round his neck and has a drum. Why his name is Herman McCarthy (53), Osage from Hominy.
