And this picture I have here is very well dressed old man in Osage clothes, with his vest, Indian shirt, got leggings, got blanket, 'round-wrapped around him. And he is wearing otter cap with feather in the back. He puts his name--his Indian name--his name was Wyld-haka (60). I believe that's grandpa isn't it? Her--them great--their grandmother's father. Are they any relation to that Wyle haka (?).

(You mean on her mother's side or--?)

On her mother's side. And this picture here I have is very beautiful picture. These two gentlemen are well dressed in Osage clothes. They have moccasins on, look like one of 'em is all beaded. Looks beautiful. Leggings. They got Northcross (?) blankets 'round them and they have Indian shirts and wearing beads and I see one got cross--wearing cross. And kerchief and one of them has long hair braided. Very pretty picture. This man is Pierce St. John (61) from Pawhuska. And the other one is named George Pitts from Hominy. (unrelated conversation) (pause) And I have another picture that's very very old picture. I have seen these in my days, I can remember. I guess when I was young. It's picture of Claremore. His name was Lah-moh. Originally lived west of town here (62). His wife and two daughters and their children--their young daughter and two babies and Mrs. Claremore Lah-moh. Her mother is very very old. She look to be in 90's. She's dressed in her Osage clothes. It's a very nice picture of them. They're
