all from Hominy.

(How you say that? La Moi?)

Huh?

(How you say that?)

Lah-mah. Claremore--Old Man Claremore. His name's Lah-mah (?). That's what Josephine's father's name is except he's a different Lah-mah.

(That's her uncle.)

Must be her uncle. I wish that reading was plain. This is two Osage men well dressed in Osage clothes (63). Lock like one is wearing a white war blanket with fancy edging on it like the old Indians used to wear and the other one has wrap-around and has leggings-buckskin leggings. Look like their name is-they are some kind of chief. Saucy Chief and one of them's-I can call that name-barely see it. (unrelated conversation) These old pictures I don't know these. School picture (64).

(These were taken up there to the --)

Agency: Agency Boarding School. Here's a picture of—this one isn't the Osages. Shall I go ahead and tell about it. This is a very old picture that these men (65) used to come down to Osage country. They are the other tribe. I believe they are Caddo. I can't recall their name. They used to come and join the peyote meetings with our tribe. I think one name is Williams.

(Which one was that?)

This one. His name was Tom Williams I think. And this old man name Lewis somebody, but I don't--I guess I know them others, but I just remember these two. Here's that old Osage man's picture (picture not included). Very nice picture of him, but I just don't know who he is. And this is a picture of lady--Mrs. Blackdog (66). Tou Blackdog and her--I imagine her granddaughter or somebody.

(This is Nettie's mother?)
