And this--I have two pictures of two ladies here (72). One of them is Mrs. Joe Red Eagle from here. And other one, her name--her maiden name was Mişs Claremore. Later she was--oh she was Yellow Horse. Later her name was Claremore. She's. the mother of Nora Stuart. This is Joe Red Eagle's wife.
(This one here--what's her nảme? Was Yellow Horse?)
Uh-huh. Yellow Horse and she was later Mrs. Claremore. She's Nora Stuart's mother. And I have another--group picture here. It seems as though they were delegations (73). This was taken in--look like Washington, or does it say? I see man named--Osage man, named (Osage name) from Hominy. And I see Mr. and Mrs. Bonna Castle from Pawhuska. And Mr. Big Horse, Andrew Big Horse. There's some I don't know. 'And Chief Baconrind from Paphuska. And it looks like Mr. Shinkey from Hominy. And Miss"Pawhuskee from Hominy. And Edgar McCarthy from Hominy. And Perry King from Fairfax. And it seems as though that might be the Superintendent. I don't know who--doesn't have anything on there, writing. That might be in Pawhuska. Looks like'. it was taken in Washington. I' have another picture here of little babe on the Indian cradle (74): Looks very pretty. The board has decoration on the head board, and that little archway is trimmed in beads. And bells hanging down. "And the little child is beint strapped on there. And beautiful yarn piece work in front strapped on. And it's layine up there up and down posine for picture. I think that's one of my babies, but I don't know which one it is. (laughter). And I have ánother picture here of two ladies--are from Pawhiska (75). The lady--one that sitting down and one's standing up. The one sittint down is Miss Baconrind: Chief Baconrind's daughter. Other one I can't recall her parents folks, but her name was Chouteau, so I imasine she was I'rom Chouteau family. Her name was Rose Chouteau. This is Louise and that's Rose.
