And this--I have two pictures of two ladies here (72). One of them is Mrs. Joe Red Eagle from here. And other one, her name--her maiden name was Miss Claremore. Later she was--oh she was Yellow Horse. Later her name was Claremore. She's the mother of Nora Stuart. This is Joe Red Eagle's wife.

(This one here--what's her name? Was Yellow Horse?)

Uh-huh. Yellow Horse and she was later Mrs. Claremore. She's Nora Stuart's mother. And I have another--group picture here. It seems as though they were delegations (73). This was taken in--look like Washington, or does it I see man named -- Osage man, named (Osage name) from Hominy. And I see Mr. and Mrs. Bonna Castle from Pawhuska. And Mr. Big Horse, Andrew Big There's some I don't know. And Chief Baconrind from Pawhuska. And it looks like Mr. Shinkey from Hominy. And Miss Pawhuskee from Hominy. And Edgar McCarthy from Hominy. And Perry King from Fairfax. And it seems as though that might be the Superintendent. I don't know who--doesn't have anything on there, writing. That might be tken in Pawhuska. Looks like it was taken in Washington. I have another picture here of little babe on the Indian cradle (74). Looks very pretty. The board has decoration on the head board, and that little archway is trimmed in beads. And bells hanging down. And the little child is being strapped on there. And beautiful yarn piece work in front strapped on. And it's laying up there up and down posing for picture. I think that's one of my babies, but I don't know which one it is. (laughter). And I have another picture here of two ladies -- are from Pawhuska (75). The lady -- one that sitting down and one's The one sitting down is Miss Baconrind: Chief Baconrind's standing up. daughter. Other one I can't recall her parents folks, but her name was Chouteau, so I imagine she was from Chouteau family. Her name was Rose Choutead. This is Louise and that's Rose.
