BACKGROUND OF INFORMANT:

Maggie Thompson Ross was seventy-one years of age at the time of this interview. She is a life-long resident of this community. She attended the Wyandotte Indian School in Ottawa County in the early 1920's. Her father was Joseph Thompson and her grandfather was Watt Belt. Mrs. Thompson is very fluent in both Cherokee and English and reads and writes both.
