We had eight of our own children and we have thirty-eight grandchildren.

(Well)

Thirty-eight.

(Thirty-eight grandchildren.)

Mrs. Wolf: Conversation inaudible--static. I can't think of what we were talking about awhile ago. They just now walked away. I don't guess you know (Name not clear), did you?

(No.)

Wiley: This highway that paved.

(Yeah)

I believe that's the time they built it.

(Uh-huh. Well you've seen a whole lot of things happen here.)

Wiley: Uh-huh.

(You've seen Rabbit Trap grow up and Mulberry Hollow. And you were born just a quarter of a mile over here?)

Yeah. Right over there.
