(They've scattered everywhere. And your father was--)

My father was an Adair.

(Adair.)

Adair is named after him.

(After the town of Adair. Yeah, I knew ---)

See that is Northside.

(That would stem in from some of your ancestors.)

Ancestors way back. I didn't know the Adairs too well. Now most of them are up around Tulsa. One of 'em married a Lawrence.

(Well my goodness.)

She was a white woman and real interesting to talk to. Her mind was so
