GENERAL SUBJECT: TOOLS AND ARTIFACTS FROM MANY YEARS AGO; FAMILY HISTORY; SOME LIFE HISTORY MATERIALS

BACKGROUND OF INFORMANT:

Coowee Meigs is 85 years old. He was born in the Parkhill Community in the Cherokee Nation. After having lived several places in this area, he now lives with a daughter near the place where he was born. Mr. Meigs is an expert craftsman and makes bows and arrows and gig poles (for frogs and fish) and also builds fishing boats. He is a descendant of Chief John Ross and lives near the Ross family cemetery.
