Hurt my back. I can tell you now--I couldn't then, but I've my back-even when I'm fishing I got (inaudible).

(Tied a bale of hay on each side.)

Yeah, just put it up together on each side, you know, and that holds 'em right up on their backs, with their feet up in the air.

(I never heard of that before.)

Put 'em on their back.

(Well, you could handle 'em that way then.)

LIVED IN PEGGS COMMUNITY FOR MANY YEARS

(You came up here in 1902. Well, what was this country like then? Was there a town there then?)

No, there wasn't but about one store here then.

(Well.)

When we first come down in this country. (Yeah.)

And they just gradually kept putting in stores. When the storm come here they was I guess a dozen or more store here. Drugstores; pool halls, and all kind of things, L & L, everything here.

Well, just all--

(End of Interview.)
