MUCH ABOUT FAMILY AND DESCENDANTS

Now I don't know too much about just Marma's, from the family. That's all I know.

(Just what family is that there now?)

She's out of Wah-Ti-anka family.

(Do you--was a--how was that when they come? Did he have--Wah tying ka man, did he have a--did he have any sisters or was it brothers?)

Well, there were a lot of them. My mother said they were about five brothers, you know. And they had one sister and this one sister had Old Man Logan.

(Not a--not a--not Roman and his bunch--)

Yes. I mean Roman Logan.

(Oh.)

Oh, these five mens. And then these five mens, some of them was out of a--like Baconrind and Shenkee. Old Man Baconrind and Old Man Shenkee. They were brothers, you know. And then a out of one man, I guess and then the Old Lady Warrior she's mother was out of one family (Osage name). And then the lady--the sister of the mens was out of Old Man Logan and John. And Bangs, Miss Bangs father, too was out of that.

(And where did Mr. Henderson come in?)

That's Old Lady's half-brother, the same mother. And the Old Man Matin. See Old Man Matin and Old Lady Warrior she and Simon, you know, they come out of one woman. That made--they all different fathers, you know.

(Oh.)

The old lady.

(And this--this old man went back there. Didn't he--didn't he pass away just after they come from Kansas?)
