But the last time I was there, that's been years ago. They had just dumped monuments all down in there.

(Yeah)

Just a laying everywhere. I don't suppose you can tell much about it,

(Yeah. Well was it still on further south, was it?)

Yesh. Right up, right up Honey Creek. Yesh.

(Up Honey Creek)

Yesh up there south of Dodge, where the little Dodge store used to be on Cowskin Prairie.

(Uh-huh)

Now this Salone Cemetery was a good size cemetery there at Salone. (words not clear) I think it's all in the wilderness now.

(Yeah)

Nobody kept it up. (static) down on Honey Creek.

(Yeah)

And it was a good size cemetery. And it's-they keep it pretty well cleaned up.

There's a boy here not too long ago his wife died and we got, we got up some money and got the party in there and cleaned it up. Pretty well up, it looks pretty well yet.

(Yes)

But I know they used to, it was a way back the Indians would all gather up and have a certain day for that cleaning up that cemetery. Had it looking nice. Course them times is past.

(Oh yes.)

All these Indian boys like that is gone. And there it is these younger generation don't pay no attention to things like that, you know.

(That's right)
