About two miles, see, right by that filling station. Probably stop at the filling station and find out. Zion cemetery. Mary Zion, I think, they named it after her. I believe. There was a Mary Zion, she was Delaware.

(Yeah I think, I see where they are going to disappear in a few years.

I have been recording them like the Jumper cemetery. It's just about gone, but its real interesting from the historical fact for the Indian that nearly all but one of those stones are all written in Cherokee.

But they were on sandstone and the characters are disappearing fast.

I can read some of it alright, but some of it's just so far eroded off with time and the weather.)

Sandstone erodes pretty fast.

(It does.)

That's just the way this here up there. I don't know somebody cut that
