Somebody didn't know too much about it, but, anyway, they put that Captain Falleaf on there. That's all there was on it. I don't whether Dad put that up there, or whether somebody else put it there. Never did know exactly.

(Yes, sir.)

See my grandmother she had twelve children, but of course they all died.

(My goodness.)

They're all dead now, of course, Dad was the last one to live. He died when I was young, and I had an uncle, he's buried over there. He was Henry Falleaf.

(Yes,)

And his wife is buried there. (Name not clear) and they had a, oh (words not clear) stone out there. Some of those stones have been there quite a while now. Uncle Henry died in 1895, I believe, before I was born.

(My goodness, that was a long time ago.)

Yeah. It's still over there now. Be about 18 somewhere 1885, '95 over there. But down there at that Silver Lake that's older stuff (Static) oh seems like '60 anyway. Somewhere in there. '60 or earlier.
