Numbered among the older Delaware families of the Copan area are the Falleats, Yellowjackets, Youngs, Ketchum, Longbone, Washington, Whitebird, and Redreathers. Decendents of the Bartles and Campbells, Barndollars and Journeycakes still live in the Bartlesville area and who have Delaware blood. Other Delaware families can still be found around Nowata county especially at Alluwe, Delaware, and Lenapah. Fred says the present day pronounciation of Lenapan is wrong. It is a Delaware word meaning "Delaware"; is pronounced 'Lee-naw-pe'.

Speaking of his family, he tells that his father was one of twelve children of the Falleaf family, who were all born in the Copan area. His grandfather, Captain Falleaf, died in 1870 and was probably the first buried at the present Falleaf Cemetery. His grandmother Falleaf remarried Col. Jackson, A Delaware, and Col. Jackson is also buried there when he died in 1905.
