But they don't do any fillings, I don't think, unless they started here lately.

(I think it's just the pregnant women.)

It is. Well, I didn't know anything about that.

(Do they clean? Have you ever heard of them cleaning any of the people's teeth?)

No. No, I never have heard that.

(Most of it is school children, isn't it?)

Yes. But they will take care of them most any time you take them there.

But they have to send them to other places when these clinics or unit directors will call dentists to take care of them.

PUBLIC SERVICES

And the public health service takes care of the bill. For that matter, anything in the way of emergencies, they take care of. But you might contact the unit director before you put any of them in the hospital. Just like a man over in Murray county, here about two months ago I got a letter from him. He had a child that had asthma - said he couldn't - went to every doctor 'round over the country tryin' to do something for this asthma this child had. So he finally found one. And this doctor was helpin' the child good - really doin' good with him. Well, he run his bill up to \$180. Well, he couldn't pay it and he sat down and wrote me to come and see if I could help him anyway or make arrangements for the public health service to pay for it - the doctor bill. I said, "Did you go to the health unit - the clinic anywhere around Tishomingo or Coalgate somewhere before you take
