And you know, have you ever seen the lake, how big it was?

(Just barely remember it.)

Well they piped it all over there. And they had them big old kettles stuck here yonder and everywhere. And they'd boil that water down and make their year supply of salt. And everybody would come and make the salt. 'Cause you couldn't but it in a store.

(What time of the year did they make salt?)

In the fall.

(In the fall of the year.)

And then they would have it up all winter. Do all their butchering, you know and those things.

(Well that would really be something.)

Well there's part of an old kettle down here in the park.

(Yes, well I've seen that one down there.)

Well that's about all.

(How many kettles did they have out there?)

You know if I counted them, I don't remember. They just set them here, yonder and everywhere. And everybody just boiled water down to make the salt.

(Well they had a chance to do a lot of visiting too while they was waiting for it. Trading maybe.

Yes they sure did.
