And they bought that land down there and this land right in front of the house, was up for sale. And my mother was full-blood enough she didn't want to be surrounded by white people. So she bought this. They had, sold it to the highest bidder. She bought that right there to keep them out. And after they couldn't get any land grant why they had to move out. J. W. Stewart as I remember, I can remember correctly he owned the first store. I don't know where they got the mail. I really don't know.

(They didn't have any post office around--)

No. And where they got their mail, I don't know. They didn't have any mail carrier in them days. But I just don't know.

(Well, has Bushyhead ever had a post office?)

Oh, no no, yes.

(At one time.)

It had a post office till a few years ago.
