(Well)

Let's see that Tucker place over there. It belonged to the Easleys. People by name of Easley. And then the Stokes place over here. Jesse Tucker has that now. I don't know any others and the Becks.

(Were the McSpaddens in here at that time?)

Yes, McSpaddens were right down in there. (name not clear) lives down there now. But Dennenburgs were over there. And Bards back over this way. I just don't know just friends.

(The community of Oowalah -- That was on south of here, wasn't it. South west of here?)

Yes, its over there by the, Round Mound. And there is coal pits all around it. And some one told me not too long ago they moved that cemetery. And I said lord I hope they didn't. If I knew that's what they were gonna do. Move it to Chelsea.

(Yes ma'am.)

It'd just pick up my mother and father and some the closer relatives.

Sometime earlier they just lit a match. Now some quite evening in the day they just burn that whole field off. Just before the rain come. When they were doing some of this some of them stones burned down. Now we've got two stones in between our families. And they have had stones out there's just the base of them there now. I don't know no more who they are than you do.

(I guess no records were kept in those early days.)

·I just don't know. Now Sarah Breeding, Al Breeding's wife, she remembers when that first baby was buried there. As I sais that stone was the beginning. (Well, was there a little store at Oowalah at one time?)

Still there.

(Its still there?)
