I am just in receipt of your letter of recent date in which you say that some non-citizens have brought into Cedar County about 350 head of cattle, and that you want to know what can be done about it. Enclosed you will find complaint which you will fill in and have the sheriff of the county sign the same and send to this office in order that I may take steps to have these parties removed as intruders. These cattle are nodoubt unlawfully held in the Choctaw Nation and I will do what I can to see that the law is enforced.

a noncitizen of the Choctaw Nation has 308
head of cattle, marked with his on right / supplem. fork on and another cattle marked
one tip in left / rough and and branded

45-S + U.K. 4, in Cedar County, Choctaw Nation,
and is holding said cattle near Post office finley I.T. or Antlers, I.T. Post Office
in said County and Nation, contrary to law.

I therefore have the honor to request that said party
and said cattle be removed beyond the limits of the Choctaw Nation
as his continued presence here is considered detrimental to the
welfare of the Choctaw people.

Dear sir:

It has been reported to this office that Indians in your part of the country are cutting cedar telegraph and telephone poles and selling the same.

You will investigate this matter, ascertain whether or not the parties doing this work have filed on the land from which they are cutting and hauling these poles, and in the event they have not been to the land office and filed on the same, and you can find them cutting, or in possession of any of such poles, it will be your duty to at once seize the poles so found, and report such seizure to this office. If the parties have filed on the land from which they are cutting this timber, however, you will simply report your finding to this office.
