Gentlemen:

Replying to your letter of the 28th inst, have to say that on the day I called for the box of groceries you sent me, it was reported to me by the agent that it was not there; but upon further investigation he ascertained that it was in another car, and that it was carried on to Quinton and there is supposed to have been unloaded; however, the next day the car was returned, and when my representative called for it that day the agent took him to the car and showed him the empty box. The agent also informed me that the car was returned to Kintah from Quinton open, and that when he first went to the car he found it that way, and that the box was empty at that time. It seems from all I am able to gather that the loss of these groceries was due to the negligence of the employees of the road in leaving the car open at Quinton, and from Quinton to Kintah, where it was found open by the Agent at this place.

So, I conclude that this box was really on the train at Kintah on the day I supposed it would be there, and was carried by, being in a car mostly loaded for Quinton, and at Quinton was left in an open car, and was either opened there or later as it was brought back.

After investigating the matter with reference to the building of the hay barn at Kintah, I have concluded that it would be a dangerous undertaking, as well as a costly experiment. I have had several talks with men who have had experience along that line and they tell me that the danger of fire is very great, and that it is a risk that insurance companies do not, and often will not handle; their reasons being that it furnishes refuge for tramps, and its proximity to the railroad renders it liable to be ignited from sparks from passing engines, and in fact they find objections too numerous to mention when you attempt to insure this class of property. I have concluded to say to you that all that portion of my barn here, except that which contains about 50 tons of hay can be used by you, and I will agree to fix a good road between here and Kintah so that the transportation of this hay will be greatly facilitated. After figuring out the Kintah proposition closely I conclude that the cost of the lot there, which will be something more than I thought, and the risk attached to the handling, in addition to the enormous insurance that we would be called upon to pay is too great, and that it would be a moneyless undertaking. My barn here is fully insured, and there will be ample room for you to store 400 tons therein, and we will not have to be bothered by having the hay insured. Hoping this explanation is satisfactory, and that you will see proper to fall in line with the suggestions contained herein, I am,

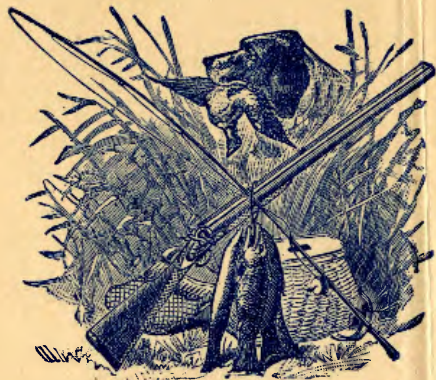
