My dear children.

I just now have the heart to write. George has been so upset and has been in a tail spin for weeks well every since he came home. that I didnt want to write until I found out definitely what he was going to do. The first trip he went out he got a school at Panama through a man that knew your Grand father. then a bunch of boys came down from Grand M and told him he was worth more than \$90 a month and that Coaches were scarce. and he went back down there and resigned and drove on over to Sallisaw and put his application in there where they payed \$123 well that was just two or three days before the

I was getting awfully discouraged
but I kept praying that God
would get him a good school.
then I decided that God was
able to do what man couldn't
do. and I felt like some boys
was working against George
prayed that God would take care
of George's problems - and George
said Dr. Bruce Love Mac Mathews
and Fry and the Booster club
went down the line for him
he came in home last night and
said he got the appointment
and you can imagine how
I rejoiced now I can write you
all with a happy heart. papa
got mad at George because he
resigned at Panama - but I didn't
I felt like he had his life to
live and we had no right to
dominate him or he wouldn't
ever be a success - if he was
dictated too. my motto was
(over)

was not to discourage
him. and I just kept on
praying for peace. papa
would put at me every
time George borrowed his
car. and of course I was to
blame for the whole thing
Thank God it is all over
every body in a good humor
George got a good job and
I am very happy. I haven't
made any plans to go up here
for that reason I felt like I needed
to be near George. Vivian and I
are going to try to come to father
providing we can. Dad wants
me to go on the train so I
can stay long as I want to -
papa is getting lots of work and
he has some competition so it
pays him to stay on the job
Folsom told you what I had
for you I guess -

you know I missed Johnson
terribly when he first left.
I really cried because he was
my best something I never
did for any of you. but I have
forgotten him now. and am
really glad he is with you
all. he was so low some for
you all. and seem like he
and Mac has the same
heart string. he just grieved
for you all. how did he
manage did he get there
with any money I was so
afraid he would get duped
by some traveling bureau
and be stranded on the way
I just wondered if I could
black my hair and get through
like he did long time. I couldn't
quit looking in his bed for
him while I'd see him
curled up with that black
hair. he stayed out alright
nearly. I kinder hate to go by

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myself: I understand Doc
is coming down next week
may be I can go back with
him on the train - I went
to the Hospital and they begged
me to stay there for a rest the
physician said I needed hospitalization
but I never felt any better in my
life - how ever he said the
was open for me come when
I got ready my blood pressure
was 200 that day - I went to
Cookson hills with Dad on
the 16th had a good time and
a nice luncheon half a chicken
abstractors meeting you know
met lots of abstractors. Sallie
Farrell had a stroke 10 days ago
and Connie said all she can
say is Oh shit. They had been
giving her the same treatment
Bobby took. my doctors give me
lots of medicine well write all
of you. we want to hear from
you. your mother
