The undersigned delegates, representing the Creek Nation in the Indian Territory, respectfully request that you cause an examination of the records of your office to be made for the purpose of ascertaining the nature of the settlements made by the Government, of the accounts of U. S. Superintendents of Indian Affairs, Elias Rector, L. W. Robertson, James Wortham and others, whose official duties involved the custody and disbursement of Creek funds, and inform them at as early a day as possible, whether or not in consequence of defalcations, any compromises were ever made with said Superintendents and others, or their bondsmen, by which sundry sums of money were lost to the Creek Nation.
