Gentlemen:

I am in receipt of your letter of February 23rd asking whether or not, in consequence of defalcations, any compromises were ever made with Superintendents Elias Rector, L. W. Robinson, James Wortham and others, by which sundry sums of money were lost to the Creek Nation. In reply I have the honor to say that no compromises were ever made with Elias Rector, or James Wortham, and the records of this office do not show that the Creek Nation lost any money through those Superintendents. In the case of L. N. Robinson, (not L. W. Robinson) your Nation appears to have lost \$2865 ⁷⁷/₁₀₀ under the following circumstances: Superintendent Robinson failed to account for \$3844 ⁴⁰/₁₀₀ belonging to the Creeks. An offer of

compromise was made by the sureties of said
Robinson and accepted by the Secretary of the
Treasury, the result of which was, that the sum
of \$978⁹³ was credited to the appropriation for
"Fulfilling Treaties with Creeks," in May 1882, and
was placed to the credit of the Treasurer of the
Creek Nation in due course. — If you have
reason to believe that your nation has lost money
through other Superintendents or agents, I will
have the records examined on your furnishing
me with the names of the supposed defaulters.
