

Dear Mr. Tiger:

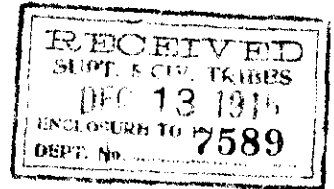
