Interview with Annie Hendrix (nee Woodal).

I was born December 8, 1852, about one mile south of my present home on the old Post place.

My father was Andy Woodall. He served in the Union Army. He died at Ft. Gibson of the Small-pox, and is buried in the National cemetery. My mother bought the old Price or Coody place before the war.

My father and mother came from Georgia, through the trail of tears, 1838.
