Mr. Mun ran a ranch near Stage stand northwest of Duncan 1894. Later Leonard Tullis ran the store.

Frank Fuque was first mayor.

Bob Sharp was first City Clerk.

I was first nightwatchman.

When Brigham Young killed Bill Paul, he had been drinking. He came into a cafe late that night, went toward the back. I was in front of Brigham and we started to the back. Just before we reached
