BORN In Iowa in 1858

I came to Oklahoma in 1870 arrived at Stonewall at Nail Hoaks before Nail was born. I came to this part about 1884. I was married in 1877 on the 4th day of April to an Indian woman and I lived with her ever since, for 60 years.

In 1884, the first herd went up the Chisholm Trail in my opinion. I have rode this country, then settled near where Doyle is now. Grass was as tall as my shoulders and I was on a horse top. Of course, this grass grew in the timber. There was no roads. We made trails. I owned cattle then.

I was in the Lee boy's fight and I think I am the only one of the boys left.

I lived in three miles of the Marlow boys.

"I could tell a lot about things but there is so much lies printed. I don't want my name mixed up in it.

Fieldworker Note: Couldn't get this man to tell anything.

His wife is a full blood Indian. He can talk their language as well as English.
