AMERICAN DAIRY FARMING MODEL.

My father came to Oklahoma shortly after the war of 1890 and bought out a claim at Edmond; later he traded around until he had three livery stables in Oklahoma City. He at one time, had a stable where the Central Fire Station now stands at California and Walker streets.

He also had seven hundred and fifty acres of land on the Canadian River about fifteen miles south of Oklahoma City. This land was a hunter's paradise; there were all kinds of game and people from Oklahoma City went out there to hunt and some of the largest coon hunts ever known in this state were held there.

There were also great wolf hunts held there. No farming was done on the place; it was kept for hunting and was well stocked.
