Dear Sir:

Below is the data you have requested concerning my father and mother.

Mary Birbridge (Willison) Shannon was the daughter of Cathrine Hettie (McIntosh) Willison and James Dandridge Willison. She was born near Fort Gibson. Cathrine Hettie McIntosh was the daughter of General Wm McIntosh, and Susanna (Roe) McIntosh. General Wm McIntosh was one of the signers of the treaty that brought the Creeks to the Ind. Terr. Roley McIntosh was a brother of General McIntosh. Chilli McIntosh was a son, so was Daniel Newman McIntosh, therefore they were brothers of Cathrine Hettie McIntosh.

Roley and Chilli McIntosh as well as many of the other McIntosh's were prominently associated with the Baptist church, but the Willison branch have been members of the Episcopal church for generations. Cathrine Hettie McIntosh was married to James Dandridge Willison at Fort Gibson June 18-1839. James Dandridge Willison, a Virginian, was a descendant of James Dandridge, a brother of Martha (Dandridge) Washington.

My father George Shannon was born near Knoxville, Tenn. Jan. 1844. He was married to Mary Birbridge Willison in 1872 near Muskogee, Ind. Terr. Five children were born to this union.

a few years following their marriage they were away from the
Terr., but returned in the fall of 1880 and settled at
son Station, where Mr. Shannon engaged in the mercantile, and
ock raising business.

In 1920, he retired from business and moved to Wagoner.

Mrs. Shannon died June 29-1889.

Four years later Mr. Shannon married.

Miss Samantha Salisbury. She passed away March 1919.

Mr. Shannon died August 9-1929, and was buried at Wagoner, Okla
