## BUCKBOARD.

Mr. Elmer Solomon gave the following description of what they called a buckboard. This is one of the conveyances they used in the Cheyenne and Arapaho run.

It was a very lightly constructed four wheel cart, with slats laid crosswise. It had but one seat, either with or without springs, and a very lightly constructed frame around edge, about one foot high.

This was drawn by either one team or two but two were used for faster traveling.
