Interview with E. E. Sorrels, et. al.

"OLD TRADING POSTS AND LANDMARKS"

Old ferry one half mile north of Ripley was first built and operated by Jim Duncan about 1893. It was abandoned about 1900. It is located on the Cimarron.

Nora, a settlement or trading post, had a store and post office. The store was operated by a Frank Jesse about 1885. Nora was two miles west and two and one half miles south of Agra.

Davis City was two miles west of Agra. It was a small settlement and a store in about 1889. It was abandoned when the railroad was built to Agra.

Bill McCoy trading post was three miles west and one half north of Cushing. It was operating in 1891.

Curtley and Wheeler store was two miles west, two and one half miles south of Drumright and was operating before the Sac and Fox Opening.

The Old Sac and Fox Chief was buried in Payne County, with his horse. His name was pronounced, Me o ta mo or Le o ta nah.
