"COWBOY DANCE"

Mr. Robert Smith made the following statements:

The dances were held in long, roundly built buildings built of the coarsest lumber and saw. The floors were terribly rough.

The music consisted of one or two men with a guitar playing very fast and loud pieces. The musicians took little time to rest after the dance once had started.

The cowboys would dress in their best coats and regular cowboy clothes; they would even wear their spurs; they never thought of taking them off.

The girls dressed in different ways, mostly in calico aprons.

Cowboys would dance awhile and then drink awhile. It was nothing uncommon for the dance to end by shooting all the lights and windows out. But there was very seldom anyone hurt.
