I came with my folks to Dixie settlement when I was six years old. Every thing was pretty wild then around there. There was a general store run by Allen and Jess Robinson, who live at Loco, Oklahoma. They had a gin and a mill.

There were no roads—just trails here and yonder. We managed to start farming, raising corn and cotton. The land was owned by a white man; however, there were a number of permits from the Indians.

Ginning was hard then—we had no suction, had to lift the cotton to the gin stand by use of baskets. It took a long time to gin one bale of cotton.

I left the Dixie settlement and went to Walters and then came to Duncan.
