When we first went to Hart there were about twelve families who lived in town but there were farmers living farther away and distance didn't make any difference then. There would be from four to six dances a week. When one dance was in progress they would tell where the next would be held. The longest dance I ever went to was a wedding dance.

It started an hour before sundown and lasted all night all the next day and all the second night. I went the first evening and danced all night; in the morning I went home and hitched the mules to a wagon, got six girls from our neighborhood, which was twelve miles away and came back to the fun. The girls brought the food.

~~Some would dance until they got tired and quit~~
and eat and others would continue the dancing. If they got too tired they would find a place and go to sleep,

wake up and start in where they had quit. I ate five meals there and there was food on the tables all the time, and when I left there was plenty of food left.

There were people from twenty miles around and some might have come from farther away.
