In 1882 and 1883 there were very few newspapers
along the railroad. All or those that appeared were
weekly newspapers.

Muskogee had two newspapers which were as follows:

The Muskogee Phoenix, with F. C. Hubbard as editor,
established in 1877. Subscription was \$1.50 per year.

Our Brother in God, Rev. F. J. Moore, as editor,
was established in 1881. Subscription was \$1.25 per year.

Coalgate had The Independent, with Geo. E. Kahn as
editor, established in 1882.

Lehigh had the Lehigh-Coalgate Leader, with W. H.
Covington as editor. Established in 1883.

Also, Vinita had the Vinita Globe, with J. J. Steward
as editor.

Also, Vinita also had the Chieftain Publishing Co.,
with L. M. Marrs, editor.

Wagoner had the Wagoner Record with Phillips and
Lindsey as editors.

McAlester had the Choctaw Herald, with E. T. Lester as editor.

Durant had the Durant Sentinel, with H. C. Halley as editor.

Eufaula had Indian Journal Printing Company, with L. A. Singleton as editor, established in 1875.

Atoka had the Indian Citizen, with Capt. J. S. Stanley and B. S. Smiser as editors.

The Indian Citizen was a paper printed in the English language and a copy was also gotten out in Choctaw for many years.

Very few of the above newspaper go by any of the above names and some have not appeared for many years.
