Mrs. Addie Martin McKinzie, who lives in Tahlequah, Oklahoma, was born January 17, 1881, Washington County, Arkansas. She is a white woman.

Father - William L. Martin  
Mother - Catherine Martin

This family came here in 1891. They were originally from Kentucky, coming first to Kansas, Arkansas and then to Indian Territory.

#### EARLY FACTORS OF INDIAN TERRITORY

I attended the old Presbyterian Mission at Park Hill from 1891 to 1899, as long as there was a school there. Miss McCarrell was Superintendent at that time. Miss Stella Mathews was the primary teacher.

I attended church at the Mission. I saw the old Sebn Chapel before it was torn down. Rev. Leeper was a minister there and later Ralph J. Lamb. Rev. Leeper and his wife were missionaries from New York. She went back east and died in child birth.

I have a Bible given me by the Rev. R. J. Lamb as a reward in Sunday School, 1894, Park Hill, I. T. The old Mission Parsonage still stands.
