My grandfether, McDaniel, was one of the first delegates to represent the Cherokee people from Tahlequah, I. T. He was one of a committee to make a treaty between the Cherokees and Celawares. He died in Mashington, D.C. and is buried in Arlington cemetery. He was a delegate when he died. They sent his old trunk back to my mother and in it was a picture of Sequoyah.

Also a picture of the old Elm tree under which the treety was made between the Cherokees and Delawares.

Sue Ayers, chief Lewis Downings last wife, was my grandfather's secretary. while he was in Mashington and she wrote a history of the treaty on the back of the picture of the Elm tree. Sue Ayers followed Chief Lewis Downing here from mashington; she waited until his sec nd wife died and then married him and lived with him until he died. Later she died and is buried at the old home now owned by Judge J. T. Parks, west of Tahlequah.

Chief Lewis Downing is buried on grand river in the Downing cemetery.

My father, John Price, was the first postmaster at Locust Grove. Mrs. Roach
