Joe Robinson born Dec. 6, 1890, Braggs, Indian Territory. Father Pleas. P. Robinson, born Dept. 18, 1859 in North Dakota. Mother's name, Henryetta Meeker, born 1870 at Braggs. Father was 3/8 Sioux Indian, mother was Cherokee. Grandfather, John Meeker, born at Braggs, date unknown. My grandfather served as Judge at the Darfield courthouse, Illinois district. He was also interpreter and guard during the strip payment. He served in the Union Army and was wounded during the Civil War. Great-grandmother's name was Lucy Starr, she came overthe trail of tears. The was a year old, 1838. They landed at Ft. Smith ark. She said the able bodied mere walked. The old women and children rode in the wagon. She said hundreds also and was buried by the side of the road. Lots of them starved to death on the way. After grandmother's family of the Indian Territory, they settled on Green Leaf Greek, near preggs in 1839. She is buried in the old Lucy Wiggins benefery, just inside the Cherokee county line, 5 miles, mest, 1 mile, north of craggs. The semetery is named after my great-grandmother, Lucy Wiggins.

Than I attended the Cherokee Male Seminary, finished in 1909. Attended Gm M. Weal, Fuliness college 308 So. 6th street, Ft. Smith, rk. took Bookkeeping, marking, phorthend, I entered the Bank of praggs for one year. I than took up besebell profession 1910 as a try out and went to ban Francisco, California.

There professional baseball twenty-one years. I went over to the Island of in onolulu. I served as wireless operator and played ball. Came back to . 3., played ball until 1932.
