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Interview with PICHARD ADMINS. (Creek- Uchee Indian)

Born, February 5, 1853, norr Fort Gibson. His family traded at Fort Gibson, Fort Smith Arkenses and Old Creek Amency Hill, northwest of Muskogee I. T.

While he was there three battles were fought between the northern and southern armies. The first Battle was at Fort Ribson, the second near Fort Davis, between Fort Gibson and Fort Davis. The third battle was fought at abd Organ Agency.

When Mr. Adding was a young boy of cight years of age, during the first year of the civil wor, he witnesded the Battle of Creek Agency. His father joined the army while at Fort Bibson. That was the last time he saw his father. He and his mother left the following year for the south to the Texas line on Red River he a Sherman Texas. They traded at Sherman Texas where they lived faring the Civil War. Flour sold for \$25.00 a barrel and coffee around a dollar a bound. He was eleven or twelve years of age when the Civil War anded.

His nother died the 1 st year of the wer. After his nothers do th he moved to old Stoner II about twenty-five or thirty miles due couth of Holdenville Ouls. He lived there satisfies was no rown man.

He married a white somen at old Stone all and was married by a lichason Indian Minister. From the reved to Durant, Oclawith his family of five children. All of the children are dead except one.

He worked with cattle on the Mail Ranch on Bir Blue Orceic, six miles north of Duræt. This Ranch was owned by Ray Floor and his step son Joe Mail. He worked for this Ranch until about 23 yes. Ago. When he moved to Musicogee, Okla. He worked in Musicogee, or souths of years, then moved to Sapulpa, Ohla, where he worked at S. W. Brown Sr. Place, at the mouth of Mickel Creek. He also worked for S. W. Brown Jr. East of Sapulpa now Linden St.

Ranch work was his main occupation. Richard Ada no other was Millie earshall daughter of Ben Marshall. She was \_ Or of Indian and \_ Euchee \_ ..dian. His Father was Thomas Adains. \_ Or ock Indian and \_ Scotch blood mus parents were raised in Indian Termitory.
