I heard this story while I was in Bristow a few months back. Seven miles east of Bristow there lives a man by the name of Allen. Mr. Allen is a white man. He was once a U. S. Marshal.

Mr. Allen has married seven Creek Indian women, all sisters. Six of them are dead and are buried in the back yard of the Allen home. Mr. Allen is living with the seventh sister.

Also in the yard is a small building that was used to keep prisoners in.
