Wiley Haines was born in Missouri in 1860 and came from Missouri to Oklahoma City in 1889 and served in some capacity as a peace officer in Oklahoma until his death in 1931.

Settling first at Oklahoma City, he was under sheriff for Sheriff Colcord, serving in that capacity for some time. Then he served as a jailer for two years.

The "boom" in Oklahoma City started about 1889, according to Mrs. Haines statement, and at that time there were many farmers on both sides of the river.

Captain Stiles was in charge of the soldiers stationed at Oklahoma City at that time.

The Haines family moved to Perry about 1895, where Mr. Haines served as Deputy Sheriff for two years. Then they moved to Lincoln County where Mr. Haines served as Indian-Police for two years. Then,

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they moved to Hominy and Mr. Haines was United States Deputy Marshal or Indian Police.

He served continuously in some capacity as peace officer in the Osage County or in Hominy until his death, but after coming to Hominy he leased and sub-leased a great deal of land for grazing and farming.
