W. A. Walker worked for Simon Lynch at Spavinaw mill and helped saw up the first log.

They traded at a store in Spavinaw run by Bumgardmer and also at Henry Cochrans store. He was a Cherckee who had the scalps of white men whom he had killed on the post out in front of his store.

Mr. Walker has an old bros are bought by his wife's father a hundred and two years ago when they left Georgia for the Territory at the time of the Removal.
