Mr. Walker's uncle Kinsee fought in the battle of Chickamauga. After the battle he was so thirsty that he drank out of the river which was red with blood.

W. A. Walker worked for Simon Lynch at Spavinaw mill and helped saw up the first log.

They traded at a store in Spavinaw run by Bumgardner and also at Henry Cochran's store. He was a Cherokee who had the scalps of white men whom he had killed on the post out in front of his store.

Mr. Walker has an old broad axe bought by his wife's father a hundred and two years ago when they left Georgia for the Territory at the time of the Removal.
