LEGEND OF

The Souix Indians secured from
F. R. Winters, 713 Braniff Building
Oklahoma City, Oklahoma

Amos Ghost, Grand father of Yellow Robe, and relative of an Indian woman of ^{Shoshoni} Souix Tribe named Sakajawea who was with Clark on his expedition.

Mr. Winters states that in 1920, Amos Ghost who was then an old man at Black Hawk, South Dakota, once told him that, his ancestors said the Great Spirit, after having considerable experience, took the best material he had and made the Black hills of South Dakota, which was his Master Piece of work. He then took the remanants of the material which he had left, and made the bad lands of Nebraska. This is Amos Ghost, Souix Indian of South Dakota's version of the creation of earth.

Yellow Robe who is a Grand son of Amos Ghost, was at that time head of Indian School at Black Hawk South Dakota, and a candidate for U. S. senate in 1920, when Mr. Winters received this legend.

Amos Ghost was a warrior in the Souix Ghost dance uprising in South Dakota in 1891, near Rapids City.
