When I was a boy the Choctaws built a brush arbor just east of a double tree, located in Section 36, Township. 3 South, Range 12 East.

For the Indians would meet and hold their ceremonies, church camp meetings, Green corn dences, the Turkey dance and Choctes (Cries".

An Indian names Cephus Jones, who lived on a small farm just north of this tree, atates that these Indian ceremonies were abandoned about 1900.

About two hundred yards west of this double tree are two good springs of water which help make this an ideal camping place.
