Mitchell hath bargained sold and delivered unto the said Overton Love a certain negro woman and two children by the names of Nance aged about twenty two one name Lilly and a boy child name unknown. I, Thomas L. Mitchell do bind myself my heirs and assigns to warrant the said negroes against all claims or claims of any person or persons what soever they maybe also to be sound in body and mind and slaves for life in the presence of witnesses I have here unto set my hand and seal this the 29th of October A. D. 1859.

Washington, May 4, 1853

Sir,

On the 22 of Augt. 1849, Lt. Col. Miler then in command at Fort Washita, Chickasaw Nation, made an order to the effect that after the 15 Sept. of that year all hogs found running at large in or around the post should be killed. Under this order hogs belonging to Chickasaws to the number of 800 to 1000 head have been destroyed. The injury and suffering they inflicted on the Chickasaws are so grievous that they cannot be submitted to without deep dissatisfaction. They cannot understand why it is their interests should be sacrificed to the convenience of a military post established among them as a mean in part of giving that protection to their persons and property which the U. States are by treaty bound to extend to them. The attention of the Indian department has heretofore been called to this subject by the late agent for the Chickasaws, and they had hoped that prompt measures would be taken to arrest the further execution of an order so oppressive, and to indemnify for loss already occasioned by it; but it seems that nothing has yet been done, and I have now respectfully but earnestly to request that said order be revoked by direction of the proper department of the government,

and that suitable instruction be given for ascertaining the number and value of the hogs belonging to Chickasaws that have been destroyed by virtue of said order, to the end that Congress may be enabled to form an appropriation to indemnify the injured parties.
