"SALI MAKING".

Common salt was an exceedingly scarce commodity during and for sometime after the close of the Civil War. When small quantities were found the price ras very high, only a small quantity costing twentyfive cents, and often the person needin, the solt had no money at all. The situation became so serious that a number of men who had returned to their homes upon conclusion of the conflict, decided to set forth Apon a salt making expedition. Procuring a wagon and team the salt se kers traveled down in the hills and forests along the Illinois river and at length reached one of the abandoned salt springs, once the scene of activity, and utilizing an old iron kettle, engaged in boiling dorn the brine for some days. Eventually each man of the pirty found himself in possession of a busnel of salt and all returned to their homes, with sufficient salt to last them during a number of months.
