MRS. KELLEY'S STORY:

"My mother was born in the Indian Territory. (before
Oklahoma) My father was born in Kentucky - his people
pioneered Missouri,

"My Grandfather (Ellis H. Harlin) was connected with
Cherokee history always - My Grandmother was born in 1800,
married Ellis Harlin in 1820 - he was interpreter for the
government agency during the removal of the Cherokees from
Georgia in 1835. - he was the first census taker appointed
by the Cherokee Nation, and was associated with James Barnette
in taking census in 1864.

"was judge & clerk of Sequoyah district. was
interpreter for the U. S. court at Van Duren Ark. when
he died; in 1867."
